The Commission is delighted that the Legal Writings (Counterpart and Delivery) (Scotland) Bill received Royal Assent on 1 April 2015. The Bill was the first to be referred to the Delegated Powers and Law Reform Committee under the new process for Commission Bills in the Scottish Parliament. <u>Read more</u>...
